





Highway 9 Iron Springs






SH 9 Corridor Context









Benefits of the Project

- Easier to construct, less traffic disruption
- Improves safety by eliminating dangerous curve
- Reduced wetland impacts
- Bikeway at gentler grade with reservoir overlook
- Water quality protection
- Improved recreation experience at shoreline
- Reduced barrier to wildlife with new crossing
- Shorter highway reduces maintenance cost
- Less extensive retaining walls



Timeline

- Contract goes to bid in January
- Expect to select contractor by mid-Feb
- 2-season job with work to start in spring of 2016
- Much of the work will not impact traffic
- Bike path will be rerouted for summer '16
- Its possible that new highway segment could be open by fall of 2016!
- New bike path along old highway section will be complete by fall of 2017



Partners

- Cash Contributions:
 - CDOT - \$20M
 - Summit County - \$337K
 - Vail Resorts - \$337K
 - Town of Breckenridge - \$337K
- In-Kind Contributions:
 - Summit County: \$2M value in taking over long term maintenance of Vail Pass recpath
 - Summit County: 8 acres of land for new ROW to exchange with CDOT for old highway ROW
 - Town of Frisco: \$475K in value for parking area donation and long term maintenance
 - CDLT: Agreeing to friendly exchange of conservation easement
